

Region 5 Trustee Report

I'm extremely excited to report that the efforts of Region 5 Representatives to reach out to and support the revival of the Madison Area Intergroup are finally paying off.

Last Saturday, Sept 29, I drove to Madison, WI, to present a three hour Traditions workshop and 10 enthusiastic members were present. They now have most of the officer positions filled and at least 6 people attended their last Intergroup meeting. This is a long way from where they were when the Region 5 Assembly traveled there in July 2016. At that time they had only a few people doing service and those people were burning out. Our open oa meeting on Saturday night must have helped plant the seeds of recovery and carrying the message. The nearby stronger Milwaukee Area intergroup pairing with Madison Intergroup also has helped.

As far back as 2011 the Region 5 Intergroup Outreach Committee looked at which intergroups attend assembly and which ones generally don't. One of the suggestions they made was to rotate the July Assembly to areas at the edge of the Region, in hopes of increasing recovery and carrying the message of the importance of doing service. In July 2015 we traveled to Louisville, KY and then to Madison 2016. After that we replaced the July face to face assembly with a conference call and the Outreach Committee of the whole so that all representatives are now working on outreach. It is really gratifying to see that sometimes the seeds we plant do grow with the consistent efforts of our members and the help from our Higher Power.

In contrast to the encouraging news from the Madison area, the Upper Peninsula of Michigan Intergroup had a final vote on Sept 15 to close their doors. It was very sad to be on the conference call and hear their final vote and the discussion of how to close the doors. The Intergroup formed in 2010 and had many retreats that drew members from long distances, but with just a few strong hard working service oriented members that lived great distances apart, they eventually were not able to keep functioning. Members from Wisconsin had been supporting them and they even drove the 1118 miles round trip from UP Mich to the Region 5 Assembly in Ft Wayne one year. I emailed in January offering to come present a workshop in July and we corresponded and called, but their closing seemed inevitable with so few members and such long distances between meetings.
